about new ministries and our learning how to hone them, I was struck by a story that was told only as a byproduct of our getting together.

On Sunday evening as we made our way to our Air-BnB, I heard a very simple story of someone breaking into a church building. Initially, this news is never something we want to hear because it sounds scary and bad. I was moved by it because of the context.

A pastor was outside of a church building with a group of people and they were told doors would be opened for them. This pastor did not belong to this church but they were invited to share in ministry with the church. Unfortunately, when this pastor got there, the doors were not left unlocked as they were told they would be and this pastor was left with a dilemma: stay outside and wait for the Trustee chair in the cold with children or find a way into the building. They chose the latter. They found an open window and were able to get the families inside.

While I think the person telling the story expected some shocked reactions, I listened and was deeply moved because it often feels like the doors that should be open are closed. I heard the story and thought of the words in scripture that have been played over a number of times, "I desire mercy not sacrifice."

This month, we are going to celebrate ministries that look for the open windows! With our worship series, we will be celebrating our ministry and looking at fresh expressions of ministry.

I look forward to sharing this new series with you!



Reflections from Psalms 100

"Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all you lands. Serve the Lord with gladness; come before his presence with singing." Psalms 100:1&2

When we look at other people around us, the fact becomes clear that everyone has some skill they are good at doing. Looking at talented actors we marvel at what they can do on the stage or screen; we say, "I could never do that." Psalm 100 is a praise song from all of creation, praising our Creator God. If one meditated on this Psalm for a time, you could feel thrilled as if you were present on one of the days of creation. The sun rises over the horizon.

Birds begin to sing; beasts that grunt or moo, sounds that roar and laugh, fish and creatures from the deep jump and splash for the joy of life God gave them.
